ANNUAL REPORT 2021-2022

GENERAL

•Fall 2021 represented a huge breakthrough in the history of LIFE at UCF. For the first time in its history, LIFE created multiple ways that its membership could participate. First, LIFE was back live and in person on the campus of UCF for the first time since the Covid Pandemic shut LIFE down in March 2020. Additionally, with technology learned during the Pandemic, LIFE was able to "live stream" all presentations from the Pegasus Ballroom in the UCF Student Union to its members wherever they were and to record all presentations and upload them to YouTube where they were available to members to see at any time on their devices.

•LIFE counted 789 members in 2021-2022 with a total budget of \$163,400.

oLIFE provided a total of \$7,000 in honorariums to LIFE speakers

oLIFE gave \$18,290 in research grants to UCF Faculty doing research on projects related to gerontology topics. These grants supported researchers in the School of Kinesiology and Physical Therapy, College of Biomedical Sciences/College of Medicine, Dixon School of Accounting, and the Department of Industrial Engineering & Management Systems.

oLIFE provided \$1,000 in an undergraduate Scholarship grant, and gerontology research grants [\$750] to two additional UCF undergraduate students.

oLIFE provided \$24,000 in Appreciation Grants to a wide variety of UCF schools, colleges and units who continue to provide generous support to LIFE. These grants included gifts to: the College of Undergraduate Studies, UCF Student Union, UCF Parking, College of Arts and Humanities including a special donation to "UCF Celebrates the Arts," College of Sciences, Office of Global Perspectives, the UCF Library, UCF Pantry, etc.

oLIFE again provided an incredible number of toys for the UCF Police Toys for Tots campaign plus \$1400 in cash donations. LIFE also generously supported the UCF Pantry with both Fall and Spring donations of food and money with over 500 lbs of food and donations of \$5,435.

CURRICULUM

- •LIFE had 52 presentations during our Fall 2001 and Spring 2002 terms with 62% of these presentations by UCF Faculty.
- •UCF presenters included faculty from: Florida Space Institute, School of Visual Art & Design, College of Undergraduate Studies, College of Arts & Humanities, College of Sciences, College of Community Innovation & Education, College of Nursing, College of Business, College of Engineering & Computer Science, Rosen School of Hospitality Management, Nicholson School of Communication, UCF Arboretum, Office of Global Perspectives, and the National Center for Forensic Science
- •The highlight of the year for our members was a presentation by UCF President Alexander Cartwright to kick off the Spring term. Dr. Cartwright is the first UCF President to present to LIFE at UCF.
- •Presentations covered a wide and diverse range of distinct topics -20 distinct discipline areas: Art/Design, Biology/Botany, Astrophysics, Music, Musical Theatre, Theatre, Psychology, Medicine, Engineering/Hydrology, 3-D Prosthetics, Disaster Management, Food Science, etc.
- •The LIFE Trippin' Committee scheduled 8 successful Field Trip experiences which involved over 200 LIFE Members. Trips were completed to: UCF Library, 2nd Harvest Food Bank, Audubon Birds of Prey Center, White Oak Conservatory, Orange County Court House, Leu Gardens, Dr Phillips Steinmetz Hall, and the Mount Dora Canal Boat Tour.

OTHER ACCOMPLISHMENTS & HIGHLIGHTS

- •The Diversity & Inclusion subcommittee became the 7th LIFE Major Standing Committee with the addition of a Strategic Plan Policy/Goal 8.
- •The combined actions of the Membership Committee, the Public Relations Committee, and the Diversity & Inclusion Committee, led to multiple diverse outreach contacts, activities, and presentations to groups all over Central Florida including retirement communities such as Legacy Point, Westminster, etc., and resulted in increased interest in LIFE and new members.
- •Created Membership Work Group to explore and discuss future directions, opportunities, and options for recruitment of new members
- •Began important reviews and revision activities to key LIFE documents such as the Strategic Plan, LIFE Policies, LIFE Organizational Chart. Strategic Plan Goal 2 was revised by the Finance Committee and a new Goal 8 regarding Diversity & Inclusion was created and approved.
- •Began investigation of a new member data management software system to improve the efficiency, security, and effectiveness of membership data management.
- •Created a LIFE Volunteer of the Year award and selected former LIFE President Ray Jones as the first recipient

- •A special event of brief presentations and followed by a research poster session by Dr. Matt Stock's UCF Physical Therapy students.
- •Had a wonderful end of year Awards Event with a special presentation/performance by Jeff Rupert and the UCF Student Jazz Group.
